CITY OF CAMPBELL, TEXAS ORDINANCE NO. 22-11-001

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A SPEED LIMIT ON A PORTION OF NORTH STREET IN THE CITY OF CAMPBELL STREET BETWEEN THE NORTH PATTERSON STREET/FM 513 AND EAST MAIN STREET/FM 499.

WHEREAS, Sec. 545.356(b-3) of the Texas Transportation Code authorizes the City to set speed limits of not less than 10 miles per hour if the governing body of the City determines that the prima facie speed limit is unreasonable or unsafe; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Campbell has determined that the current prima facie speed limit of North Street between its intersection with North Patterson Street/FM 513 and East Main Street/FM 499 is unreasonable and unsafe; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Campbell, Texas has determined that a maximum speed limit twenty-five(25) miles per hour is a reasonable and safe speed on North Street between its intersection with North Patterson Street/FM 513 and East Main Street/FM 499.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF CAMPBELL, TEXAS:

- 1. The maximum speed limit on North Street between its intersection with North Patterson Street/FM 513 and East Main Street/FM 499 in the City Limits of the City of Campbell shall hereafter be twenty-five (25) miles per hour.
- 2. The Mayor or his designee shall erect signs and other appropriate markings as necessary to designate said maximum speed limit.
- 3. All traffic control maps of the city shall be amended hereby to reflect this Ordinance.
- 4. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a Class "C" misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined in a sum not to exceed \$200.00.
- 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.
- 6. If any section, subsection, and sentence or phrase of this ordinance is declared to be invalid, it shall not affect the validity of this ordinance.

7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval and upon the erection of signs or markings giving notice of the reduced speed limit.
